What's New At The Museum BY KATHY TREXEL REED

The current show from The Guild of American Papercutters Permanent Collection is "Antique & Contemporary Papercutting." It will continue until April 2019.

Twenty four papercuttings from the Guild's permanent collection are currently mounted on the walls of the GAP Museum Gallery. Many additional small works are also featured with captions in the glass display case there. United by traditional approaches, the display includes works from the McDaniel Collection as well as more recent member papercuttings since 1988, selected by the Acquisition Committee. This impressive exhibit marks with pride the 2018 Thirtieth Anniversary of the Guild.. Next year we will observe the Tenth

Anniversary of the establishment in 2009 of the GAP National Office and GAP National Museum in Somerset, Pennsylvania. A fresh display of different artworks from the Permanent Collection will celebrate the on-going cooperation between GAP and Laurel Arts at the Dressler Center, Somerset, Pennsylvania.

During recent summer months of June and July, 2018, twenty-five GAP members participated in Laurel Arts Tenth Triennial Exhibit titled "What's Cooking?" The juror awarded Margaret Herbener, Pennsylvania, the Papercutting Award, a \$200 gift certificate, for her "Lily Pond at Sunset" (18" X 24"). Other cut paper entries were juried into the Gallery Shoppe at Dressler.

Two additional papercuttings from those submitted joined the Permanent Collection, as invited by the Acquisition Committee after viewing a CD of the members' works. The new additions are: "You Are What You Eat" (77cm X 60cm) by Susan Throckmorton of Poland, and "Still Life With Grapes" (9" X 4") by Gene Toutsi of Virginia.

CraftNOW AT THE KIMMEL CENTER, PHILLY





Board Member Profile: Melanie Kehosss

CO-VICE PRESIDENT OF MEMBERSHIP

Raised in the suburbs of Milwaukee, WI, Melanie Kehoss is an artist and art instructor living in Arlington, VA. Shortly after graduating from Lawrence University in Appleton, WI, she began to explore papercutting as an alternative to digital media. She continued to experiment with various cutting approaches as a graduate student at University of Wisconsin-Madison, employing craft foam, fleece, and paint swatches.



In 2008, Melanie began displaying her papercuts as lightboxes, which remains her signature art form. She writes about her work:

I make light boxes to create the feeling of looking into another world. Mirrors lining the interior create the impression of a limitless scene. The cultures referenced within the tableaux inspire the patterns framing the images, and backlighting brings the papercuts to life.

Melanie has lectured at Georgetown University, Carthage College, and University of Wisconsin-Madison. She currently teaches drawing, painting, and design for children and adults at Arlington Arts Center and US Arts Center-Chantilly. In addition to serving on GAP's board, she

manages an annual studio tour in Arlington.
